To file a notice of infringement with us, you must provide a written communication (by fax or regular mail, and not by email) that sets forth

the items specified below. Please note that pursuant to that Act, you may

be liable to the alleged infringer for damages (including costs and attorneys' fees) if you materially misrepresent that you own an item when

right to request removal from our service, we suggest that you first contact an attorney.

To expedite our ability to process your request, please use the following format (including section numbers):

1. Identify in sufficient detail the copyrighted work that you believe has been infringed. For example, "The copyrighted work at issue is the text that appears on [www.google.com/ads](http://www.google.com/ads)."
2. Identify the material that you claim is infringing the copyrighted work listed in item #1 above.

FOR WEB SEARCH, YOU MUST IDENTIFY EACH SEARCH RESULT THAT DIRECTLY LINKS TO A WEB PAGE THAT ALLEGEDLY CONTAINS INFRINGING MATERIAL. This requires you to provide (a) the search query that you used, and (b) the URL for each allegedly infringing search result. (Note that the URL for each search result appears in green at the end of the description for that search result.)

For example, suppose (hypothetically) that you conducted a search on google.com using the query 'google', and found that the third and fourth results directly link to a web page that you believe infringes the copyrighted text you identified in item #1 above. In this case, you would provide the following information:

FOR GOOGLE GROUPS, YOU MUST IDENTIFY EACH MESSAGE THAT ALLEGEDLY CONTAINS INFRINGING MATERIAL. For our current beta implementation, this requires that you provide the URL that appears in the address bar of your browser while you are viewing the message at issue. The URL should begin with "http://groups.google.com/groups?". If the URL represents a thread (rather than a single message), you must also identify the message within the thread (e.g., message 3).

3. Provide information reasonably sufficient to permit Google to contact you (email address is preferred).

4. Provide information, if possible, sufficient to permit Google to notify the owner/administrator of the web page that allegedly contains infringing material (email address is preferred).

5. Include the following statement: "I have a good faith belief that use of the copyrighted materials described above on the allegedly infringing web pages is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law."

6. Include the following statement: "I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in the notification is accurate and that I am the copyright owner or am authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed."

7. Sign the paper.
