1. Identify in sufficient detail the copyrighted work that you believe has been infringed.

Insider TA™ (Copyright©1995-2002, Stock Blocks, Inc.) is investment software for stock traders, operating on the Windows 9x/Me/2000/NT/XP platform. We have advertised in several trade publications over the past eight years, as well as being the topic of several software reviews, both web-based and in print. Insider TA is also sold on our web site at <http://www.stockblocks.com>.

The copyrighted work at issue are various newsgroup spams that appear in <http://groups.google.com/groups>.

2. Identify the material that you claim is infringing the copyrighted work listed in item #1 above.

Using Google's *Advanced Search*, I searched groups for the phrase "Insider TA" from *Jan. 1, 2001 to the present day*. The results show 5 listings, all of which are posts by one bootlegger who uses the anonymous email [REDACTED] with various aliases:

Although there are a number of warez sites on anonymous web-hosting services (some of which have Insider TA listed), none of them -- as far as I know -- are under the jurisdiction of Google.com. So I have no information to provide for this section.

My only request to Google is to remove the above bootlegger postings that solicit the illegal sale of our software, Insider TA.

I have a good faith belief that **use of the copyrighted materials described above** on the allegedly infringing web pages **is not authorized by the copyright owner**, its agent, or the law.

I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in the notification is accurate and that I **am the copyright owner** or am authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.
