This letter is to inform you about the following site, which appears on Google, that has wrongfully taken the entire material from my web page and used it as its own in violation of copyright law and DMCA standards.

1. The original material is from The Prisoner's Dictionary:

2. The copyrighted material that is being used appears on  
<<http://www.boyzbehindbars.com/connections/dictionary.html>>
3. The search queries that I used to find the infringing web page on Google were:
  - a. boyzbehindbars
  - b. boyzbehindbars.com
  - c. prison dictionary
  - d. prison slang
  - e. prisoner dictionary

In some cases, searching within the results was easier, although  
<[www.boyzbehindbars.com/connections/dictionary.html](http://www.boyzbehindbars.com/connections/dictionary.html)> was the fourth result given in the  
"prison dictionary" search.

4. My contact information is listed above. The infringing page is owned by [REDACTED]

5. I have a good faith belief that use of the copyrighted materials described above on the allegedly infringing web pages is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.

In particular, the cached version of the infringing page that is displayed on Google (as of today) still contains the links to the Amazon associates account for the Other Side of the Wall: (<http://www.amazon.com/exec/obidos/ASIN/0916500144/theothersideoflh>). BoyzBehindBars changed these links after they were notified that this demonstrated their blatant copyright infringement, but I have retained a .pdf copy of the page should the Google cached version be changed.

The Internet Archive at <http://web.archive.org/web> contains version of my dictionary at [dictionary.prisonwall.org](http://dictionary.prisonwall.org) from the year 2000 (when the subdomain was established), including the 2001-2002 page that BoyzBehindBars copied (and wrongfully ascribed its own copyright).

The Internet Archive at <http://web.archive.org/web> contains copies of my dictionary that was found at its former address at [www.wco.com/~aerick/lingo.htm](http://www.wco.com/~aerick/lingo.htm) going back as far as December, 1996.

The Internet Archive at <http://web.archive.org/web> contained the BoyzBehindBars dictionary from February, 2002. It also contains the links to my Amazon associate account.

The Prisoner's Dictionary was established in 1995 and has been featured on various internet sites as well as academic and news publications. I have established a separate page to call attention to the copyright infringement (which is also found on the Google search engine) at <http://prisons.home.comcast.net>.

I notified Mr. [REDACTED] and requested him to remove the dictionary from his web page, including the copyright notice that he attached to my material. He responded, "Get over yourself. The page stays where its at." I notified his parent company, [REDACTED] Internet Services of this and Mr. Page responded by changing the links to my Amazon associate account, but left the infringing material in its place.

Mr. [REDACTED] has been notified that this site infringes upon copyright law and the protections afforded the DCMA.

6. I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in the notification is accurate and that I am the copyright owner or am authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.
